Discussion *read: Matthew 7:1-6 (read together out loud in group)*

1. Not all judgment is bad. You made a judgement about this care group without realizing it. It's obvious that there is a destructive type of judgment (Condemning criticism, appearance judgment). Have you ever been affected by this type of judgment? How?

2. We are all unqualified to be the judge in someone else's life because we are Fallible and Fallen people. We are not their master! We do not know the MIND or MOTIVES. We do not know all the facts and we are not perfect ourselves. Why is it important to leave the ultimate judging and prosecuting up to God? (clue: some of the answers are in the statements above.)

3. Before we are spiritually healthy enough to point out someone else's faults (to help them like a medical doctor would a patient), it's vital that we examine ourselves first. Explain why is this so important?

4. Give examples of healthy and delightful judgement. What does it look like to you? How would God want you to confront someone else?
